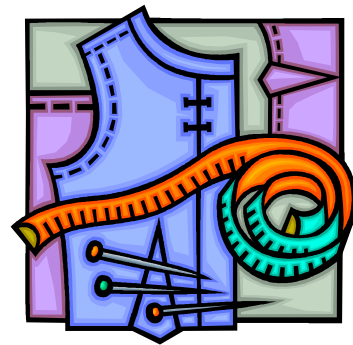

Hooded Raincoat—Part Two—Pockets, Sleeves and Hood

We've started our Raincoat, and it's time to do a little more work. In January we worked cutting out parts of the jacket and stitching the darts, and you finished those jobs at home. This month we will finish the pockets and make the hood. Then we'll put at least one of the sleeves in, and let you stitch the rest of the sleeves at home.

- Supplies
 - Sewing Machine, with foot control and power cord
- Accessories
 - Standard presser foot
 - Edge Stitching foot
 - **OR**
 - Walking foot if using laminated fabric
 - Teflon or Non-Stick foot if using laminated fabric
- Thread
 - Metrosene 100% polyester thread to match fabric for construction
 - A bobbin wound of the same thread
 - Metrosene Cordonnet thread—white or beige is fine
- Needles (depending on your fabric)
 - Schmetz Universal size 80/12 or 90/14 for standard fabrics
 - Schmetz Microtex or Jeans size 80/12 or 90/14 for laminated fabrics
- Notions
 - Your pattern and fabrics
 - Fabric shears (7" – 8")
 - Scissors for clipping and thread trimming (4"-5" Ginghers Craft or Embroidery scissors)



- Notions con't
 - Water Erasable Marking pen or pencil (color that will show up on your fabric)
 - Rotary cutter and ruler
 - 8" x 11" cutting mat
 - Fine Glass Head pins
 - **OR**
 - Binding Clips if using laminated fabric (you may find you like these better than pins for any project) or
 - Collins Double sided tape for laminated fabrics
