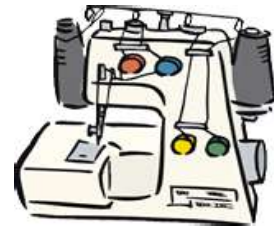

Serger Club March 2012 Two Thread Serger Bag

Have you ever wondered what that converter device that either came with your machine or is on your machine next to the upper looper is for? We will be using it to decorate our bag with all the 2 thread stitches that our machines can do! Although we will be doing most of the bag with two threads---our final construction is with a 4 thread overlock stitch. We will see how easy it can be to totally use all parts of our serger!!

Supplies for Club

- Serger, ready to serge
- Foot control and power cord
- Standard presser foot/or clear

Thread

- 1 spool of contrasting or matching (RA-poly Deco Floss, YLI's-Pearl Crown Rayon, Designer 6, or Jeans Stitch Thread, or Sulky's-12wt. Blendable) thread
- 4 spools matching thread for construction

Needles

- Schmetz Universal size 90/14

Presser Feet

- cording or Beading foot
- Blind Hem Foot

Notions

- Rotary Cutter and ruler
- Fabric scissors and snips
- Glass Head pins
- Fray Check Seam Sealant
- Double Eye Needle or Bodkin
- Sewline Glue Stick or Wonder tape
- 3 yds. 1/8"-1/4" wide cording

Fabric

- 2 contrasting Home Dec, faux suede, and 1 medium weight cotton for lining
- Fabric A—1/2 yd. Main Fabric---for the top, bottom, and handle pieces
Cut ---1-bottom 12"wx8"long, 2-top 12"wx4"long, 2-handles 4"wx17" long
- Fabric B—1/6yd. Contrasting Fabric---for the middle piece
Cut 2- 12"wx 5" long for middle piece
- Fabric C—fat quarter will work if it is none directional
Cut 1-12"wx16"long---for the lining

Bring all extra scraps of fabric to class!
